

**Rockcastle County Fiscal Court
Regular Called Meeting
December 13, 2022**

Judge Holbrook called the meeting to order with the following present: Squire Thacker, Squire Bishop, Squire McGuire, and Squire Prewitt. Also present: Sheriff Shannon Franklin, County Attorney Jeremy Rowe, Jailer Nathan Carter, Treasurer Joseph Clontz and Fiscal Court Clerk Vickie Miller.

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 8, 2022 - Motion was made by Squire Thacker, seconded by Squire Bishop, with all voting aye to approve the minute as presented

MINUTES OF NOVEMBER 29, 2022 - Motion was made by Squire Prewitt, seconded by Squire McGuire, with all voting aye to approve the minute as presented

ROCKCASTLE COUNTY INDUSTRIAL AUTHORITY REPORT – Information only

ROCKCASTLE COUNTY DEVELOPMENT BOARD PROGRAM SUPPORT \$1,148.00 - Motion was made by Squire Prewitt, seconded by Squire McGuire, with all voting aye to approve Rockcastle County Development Board's program support for \$1,148.00.

LARRY DAVIDSON – Larry Davidson requested a listing of all equipment the Fiscal Court purchased for Livingston security. County Attorney Jeremy Rowe stated he would create a listing of know purchases.

LINDSEY KING – Miss King wanted updates on the Animal Shelter. Judge Holbrook said the Fiscal Court had requested procedures from different Animal Shelters in the surrounding counties pertaining to Rescue Operations. He has not received information from Pulaski County but Lincoln County did send in their requirements for Rescue Groups. Judge Holbrook had his secretary to call several times with no response. Miss King wanted the Fiscal Court to make a verbal agreement with her to require Director Carpenter to take pictures of both cats and dogs and require him send the pictures to rescue groups. She wanted Director Carpenter to be held accountable for each animal and to inform her about all animals brought into the shelter. The Fiscal Court agreed that Mr. Carpenter would post pictures of the cats along with the dogs brought in.

CLERK'S SETTING MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF DEPUTIES AND ASSISTANTS SALARIES - Motion was made by Squire Prewitt, seconded by Squire McGuire, with all voting aye to approve setting the Clerk's Maximum Amount of Deputies and Assistants Salaries at \$254,000.00 for 2023

ROCKCASTLE COUNTY CLERK, DANETTA ALLEN 2022 BUDGET - Motion was made by Squire Bishop, seconded by Squire Thacker, with all voting aye to approve Rockcastle County Clerk's 2023 Budget as presented.

SHERIFF'S SETTING MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF DEPUTIES AND ASSISTANTS SALARIES - Motion was made Thacker, seconded by Squire McGuire, with all voting aye to approve Setting Maximum amount of Deputies and Assistants salaries at \$375,000 for 2023 budget.

SHERRIFF'S BUDGET PROPOSAL – Motion was made by Squire McGuire, seconded by Squire Bishop with all voting aye to approve the Sherriff's Sheriff's Budget Proposal for the upcoming budget.

ADMINISTRATIVE CODE – Motion was made by Squire Thacker, seconded by Squire McGuire with all voting aye to amend the Administrative Code as follows:

1. Employees are allowed to take the maximum of 80 of unpaid absences with Supervisor approval yearly.
2. Covid Absenses – no changes -to pay full time employees that is out of their probation period, 5 days wages with positive test and no symptoms or 10 days with positive test with symptoms.

3. Drug screening – zero tolerance for any drugs.

KACO WORKERS COMPENSATION AUDIT INVOICE \$3,854.00 – Motion was made by Squire McGuire, seconded by Squire Bishop with all voting aye to approve the payment of \$3,854 for the Workers' Compensation Audit.

GRAYHAWK RD (CR-1745) - Motion was made by Squire Bishop, seconded by Squire Prewitt with all voting aye to end county maintenance at 1130 feet. Public hearing was held on 12/13/22 with no opposition or concerns from the public.

BIG ORCHARD RD (CR-1371) – Motion was made by Squire Bishop, seconded by Squire McGuire with all voting aye to end county maintenance at 2430 feet. Public hearing was held on 12/13/22 with no opposition or concerns from the public.

RAVENWOOD LN – Motion was made by Squire McGuire, seconded by Squire Bishop with all voting aye to add Ravenwood Ln to the county maintained road system.

LIVINGSTON GYM RENTAL REPORT \$930 Information only.

LIVINGSTON SECURITY – City of Livingston reimbursed the county \$2,500 for the past two and half months of no police officer at Livingston.

LIVINGSTON LEASES/RENTALS – Judge Holbrook asked County Attorney Jeremy Rowe to review all lease and/or rental agreements made involving County owned buildings in Livingston. These will be discussed at the next Fiscal Court meeting.

SHELTOWEE TRACE TERMINATION NOTICES – Motion was made by Squire Prewitt, seconded by Squire McGuire with all voting aye to accept the termination notices from Sheltopee Trace Association for the two rooms in the Livingston School.

OPENING VEHICLE BIDS – Motion was made Squire McGuire, seconded by Squire Thacker to purchase a 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 2500HD for \$56,076 from Dan Cummins - no votes – motion dies. Bachman Commercial had sent in worksheets for 3 vehicles under the state contracted price which was a 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 3500HD 4WD Reg Cab \$41,347.00, a 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 3500HD 4WD Crew Cab \$49,302.40 and a 2023 Chevrolet Silverado 3500HD 4wd Double Cab \$42,543.60.
