## Rockcastle County Fiscal Court Regular Called Meeting May 14, 2024

Judge Holbrook called the meeting to order with the following present: Squire Thacker, Squire Adams, Squire McGuire, Squire Denney and Squire Prewitt. Also present: Jailer Nathan Carter, Sheriff Shannon Franklin, County Attorney Jeremy Rowe and Fiscal Court Clerk / Treasurer Vickie Miller.

**MINUTES OF APRIL 9, 2024** – Motion was made by Squire Adams, seconded by Squire McGuire with all voting aye to approve the minute as presented.

**MINUTES OF APRIL 25, 2024** – Motion was made by Squire Thacker, seconded by Squire Denny with all voting aye to approve the minute as presented.

**LIVINGSTON TRAIL TOWN REPORT** – Information only.

**ROCKCASTLE COUNTY DEVELOPMENT BOARD \$1,155** - Motion was made by Squire McGuire, seconded by Squire Prewitt with all voting aye to approve the program support of \$1,155.

**RILEY SMITH, FCCLA (FAMILY, CAREER AND COMMUNITY LEADERS OF AMERICA)** – Ms. Smith gave her presentation about poverty in Rockcastle County to the Fiscal Court. She informed the court FCCLA has 8 members that will compete at the national level in Seattle, Washington and requested a donation to FCCLA to help pay for expenses.

**ROCKCASTLE COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY REPORT** – RCIDA Director Jeff VanHook informed the court the 2<sup>nd</sup> reimbursement will be made from the KPDI Grant in the near future. He requested the Fiscal Court to approve transferring the deposit amount, up to the original grant of \$801,000, to the RCIDA. Motion was made by Squire Thacker, seconded by Squire Prewitt with all voting aye to transfer the deposit of up to \$801,000 to RCIDA.

**ROCKCASTLE COUNTY EXTENSION DISTRICT FY2024-2025 BUDGET** - Motion was made by Squire Prewitt, seconded by Squire McGuire with all voting aye to accept the FY24-25 Rockcastle County Extension District Budget.

**MEDICAL CANNABIS** – Darren Allen, retired State Police, addressed the court about the dangers of medical marijuana and what he has personally witnessed while being a State Policeman. He also gave some facts about cannabis like hinders brain development up to 25 years old, illegal under Federal law, impacts the workplace negatively and leads to violent tendencies.

Rachelle Riddle – pharmacy tech, addressed the court about the advantages to medical cannabis. She stated a person could grow their own medicine to help with seizures or cancer symptoms. She stated it was only a gateway drug when purchased through a drug dealer. She said the County would be left behind and the revenue from jobs created would be made in another county.

County Attorney Jeremy Rowe said the County had 4 options:

- 1. The County could take no action which would allow medical cannabis businesses to operate in the county.
- 2. Pass an ordinance to prohibit cannabis operations.
- 3. Pass a resolution to put the matter of cannabis operations to a public vote.

4. Place restrictions and /or collect fees related to cannabis businesses operating within the county.

**AUTISM FOUNDATION** –Dr. Bishop Jasmin L Booker from the Autism Foundation informed the Fiscal Court they were no longer interested in the Livingston School Building due to the substantial list of items that would need to be repaired from the Fire Marshall. She stated they would respectfully back away from the property.

**VETERANS PARK 4"X8" BRICK \$250.00** – Motion was made by Squire McGuire, seconded by Squire Thacker with all voting aye to purchase a brick with the County's logo engraved on it.

**COUNTY CLERK DANETTA ALLEN \$3,428.40 CALCULATION OF TAX BILLS** – Motion was made by Squire Adams, seconded by Squire Denny with all voting age to approve payment of \$3,428.40 for calculation of tax bills.

**NATIONAL FORESTRY RECEIPTS – SCHOOL SHARE TITLE I \$11,134.58** – Motion was made by Squire Adams, seconded by Squire Thacker with all voting aye to give the required 50% of the National Forest Receipts Title I payment in the amount of \$11,134.58 to Rockcastle County School.

**AUDITOR OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS \$4,995.12 – SHERIFF'S 22-23 TAX SETTLEMENT AUDIT** – Motion was made by Squire Prewitt, seconded by Squire McGuire with all voting aye to approve the payment of \$4,995.12 to Auditor of Public Accounts for the Sheriff's 22-23 Tax Settlement Audit.

**AOC ANNUAL REIMBURSEMENT APPLICATION - \$175,000.00** – Motion was made by Squire Adams, seconded by Squire Prewitt with all voting aye to approve the AOC estimated reimbursement of \$175,700.

**REVERSE SALT AUCTION** – Motion was made by Squire Adams, seconded by Squire McGuire with all voting aye to participate in KACo's reverse salt auction.

**COUNTY ROAD RESOLUTION** Motion was made by Squire Adams, seconded by Squire Prewitt, with all voting aye to approve the County Road Aid Resolution with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet.
